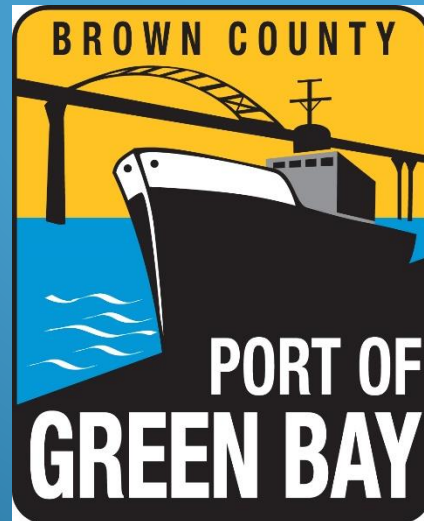

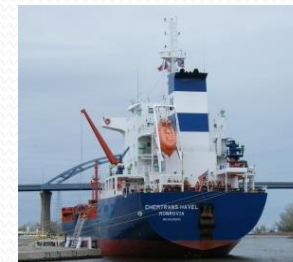

KEY 2021 PORT TAKEAWAYS

- 14 active Port businesses spanning over 3 miles of the Fox River
- 1,968,967 metric tons shipped in 2021
- 2.5% increase in tonnage over 2020
- Increased diversification in cargo
- Increase in domestic imports of limestone & cement
- Increase in foreign imports of petroleum products & wood pulp
- Increase in domestic exports in project cargo
- 7% increase in 2021 vessels totaling 178

2022 PORT HIGHLIGHTS

- Advancing Beneficial reuse of Dredge Material
- Advance Renard Island Master Plan as a location for the Green Bay NERR research facility
- Complete site design and engineering for newly acquired Port development property while continuing to pursue state and federal grant opportunities
- Continue efforts to host Great Lakes cruise ships
- Work towards a Navy ship commissioning held in Green Bay in 2023
